KADUNA GANG VICTIM'S DEATH TRIGGERS PROTEST

The death of one of the victims of the notorious gangsters known as "KTL thieves" yesterday triggered a peaceful protest in Makera area of Kakuri in Kaduna.

Penultimate Saturday, members of the notorious gang who specialised in looting equipment at the closed Kaduna Textile Limited (KTL) attacked residents of Makera injuring five persons.

The victims were receiving treatment at the St. Gerard Hospital but one of the victims, simply called Abdulrahaman died yesterday following the injuries he sustained during the

Our correspondent gathered that the deceased was buried at the Tudun Wada Muslim burial ground.

It was gathered that shortly after the burial, the youths of area went on a peaceful protest calling on the state government and security agencies to investigate the activities of the gang and their accomplices.

The protest caused pandemonium at the popular Kakuri market as traders hurriedly closed their shops in fear of them being vandalised.

The state commissioner of police, Mr. Olufemi Adenaike had shortly after last week's attack said his men have arrested seven of the gang members.

He said the suspects would be paraded before newsmen with the guns recovered from them last week Monday but this was not to be citing investigation was still on-going.

"We couldn't parade the suspects because investigations have not been completed on the case," he said.
