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BARBER RUN OVER, DIES AT KUBWA



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A 28-year-old barber was on Tuesday run over and killed by a speeding vehicle along Kubwa-Zuba Expressway.

The man, who owns a barbing salon at Gwarinpa, had visited a friend at Kubwa and was returning to Suleja where he lives when the accident occurred, a witness said.

"The man was crossing the expressway from the Phase 3 Junction Kubwa when the car which was on top speed knocked him down," he added.

He said the deceased did not die on the spot but sustained serious injuries and was quickly rushed to the Kubwa General Hospital by his friends.

Similarly, a 72-year-old beggar was knocked down in the evening of same day by a motorcyclist while crossing a road along Dutse-Alhaji in Bwari Area Council.

A witness said the beggar, who used to come to Kubwa from Dutse was returning home when he was knocked down by the cyclist.

According to the witness, the beggar sustained fracture on his left leg and was taken to the Kubwa General hospital by an official of the Nigerian Security and Civil Defence Corps.

When contacted, the head, accident and emergency unit of the hospital, Paul Olise, confirmed the accidents, saying the barber, who was brought to the hospital in an unconscious state, later died and had been deposited at the hospital morgue, while the beggar was later carried away by the civil defence officer, as no relation was available to identify with him.



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
