

THREE PEOPLE DIE, 17 INJURED IN BAUCHI AUTOCRASH

Three people have been killed, while seventeen others sustained various degrees of injuries after the vehicle they were traveling in was involved in an accident about 25 kilometres away from an army checkpoint in Gindin Tsamiya village in Darazo local government area of Bauchi State.

Sunday Trust correspondent gathered that the accident which occurred in the morning involved a Toyota Camry with plate number AKK 281 AA and a Toyota commercial bus with registration number XA 789 GML.

The Bauchi State Sector Commander of the Federal Road Safety Corps, Mr Sunday Henry Olatunji, who confirmed the accident, saying two men and a male child died.

Mr Sunday attributed the cause of the crash to over-speeding and overloading. He cautioned commercial drivers to always adhere to traffic rules and regulations while undertaking any journey.
