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TRIAL OF POLICEMAN FACING MANSLAUGHTER CHARGES BEGINS NOV 20



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A Chief Magistrates' Court in Yaba, Lagos State Tuesday fixed Nov. 20 for the trial of **Sgt. Solomon Uduh, facing manslaughter charges.**

The Chief Magistrate, Mrs Y.O Aje-Afunwa fixed the date, following an advice by the Directorate of Public Prosecutions (DPP) that the court should continue with the trial of Uduh for the killing of Mr Dotun Karonwi.

Aje-Afunwa said: "The court has admitted the advice on the directive of the DPP and fixed Nov. 20 for trial."

Odu, who was arraigned on Oct. 10 for manslaughter, had been remanded in prison custody.

The police prosecutor, ASP. Felix Ifjen, alleged that **the accused shot Karonwi at close range, during a mob attack on his duty post at Eric Moore Surulere, Lagos, on March 16.**

Ifjen added that **the accused shot Karonwi in the head with an AK47 at 11.15 p.m.**

He said the offence contravened the provisions of Section 227 of the Criminal Code, Laws of Lagos State 2011. (NAN)

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
