3-YEAR-OLD BOY CRUSHED TO DEATH AT DUTSE

A 3-year-old boy was on Friday crushed to death in front of his house at Dutse in Bwari Area Council of the FCT.

A witness said the deceased had come out with his mother from the house and was about to cross the road when one of their neighbours knocked him down while driving out of the compound.

"The little boy loosened grip of his mother's hand and strayed towards the entrance of the compound before he was knocked down," the witness added.

The witness further added that the deceased died instantly and was taken to the Kubwa General hospital.

Similarly, a middle-aged security man survived gun shot from armed robbers at his duty post in a block industry at Dutse.

City News learnt that robbers stormed the industry in the early hours of that day with the intention of carting away some equipment.

It was however gathered that their mission was unsuccessful as they were scared away by the victim, who unluckily sustained a gun shot at the back in the process.

The victim, City News further learnt, was later taken to the Kubwa General hospital for medical attention.

Police in the area said the two cases have not been reported to them but the head, Accident and Emergency unit of Kubwa General Hospital, Paul Olise, said the three-year-old boy was brought in dead, and had since been moved away by the family.

He said the security guard that received the gun shot was immediately attended to and had since been discharged.
