Jigawa State Command of the Nigerian Security and Civil Defence Corps(NSCDC) yesterday arrested one Hauwa Sanni, 20, for allegedly conspiring with one Nasiru Sani, 40, of Aduware quarters in Babura Local Government Area of Jigawa State to bury a baby alive.
