



TWO MORE WUKARI VILLAGES ATTACKED



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Two more villages in Wukari, Taraba State, were attacked yesterday, Daily Trust gathered.

This comes after the Sunday's attacks, where about 20 people were killed and several others injured.

A resident, Jolly Agbu, told Daily Trust that gunmen in the early hours of yesterday launched attacks on Dapye and Nwuka villages, forcing villagers to flee the area while their crops were destroyed.

He could not ascertain the number of casualties arising from the latest attacks on the villages.

But the Taraba Police Command said normalcy is gradually returning to the area, after Sunday attacks on Nwuban and Nbishi villages.

The command's spokesman, ASP Joseph Kwaji, said there were no further attacks following the deployment of security personnel to the area.

He said security men have been patrolling the area.

Kwaji said only 13 persons were killed and about 50 houses razed in the attacks launched on the villages on Sunday, adding that a dispensary and two churches were also razed in the attack.

He said no arrest has been made and that investigation is ongoing to apprehend the perpetrators.

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
