

3 perish in Abuja auto crash

Three persons were trapped to death in the wee hours of Saturday following an accident in which a commuter bus rammed into a stationary truck at Kamadi village, on the Abuja-Lokoja Expressway.

City News learnt that three others who survived but sustained various degrees of injuries were rescued by men of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) and taken to Kwali General Hospital.

A witness said the accident happened around 4.12 am when the bus marked XC 236 RNN, conveying pineapples and oranges, rammed into a broken down trailer.

"It was the driver and two other passengers sitting in front that were trapped. Some villagers alerted the FRSC officials, who came to remove their

corpses," he said.

When contacted, the Yangoji unit commander of the FRSC, Assistant Corps Commander Jeremiah M. Fada, confirmed the accident.

He attributed it to over speeding and loss of control, saying the corpses have been deposited at the Kwali General Hospital morgue and that the injured were also taken to the same hospital.

He further disclosed that four persons were also injured in another motor accident which occurred on Friday evening near Kwaita Bridge, on the same Expressway.

According to him, the accident happened around 4.32pm when the driver of a Toyota Hiace bus with registration number NX 385 MNL lost control and crashed into a ditch.

He said the victims were taken to Kwali General Hospital.
