Driver dies, 4 injured in head-on collision at Yangoji

An unidentified middle-aged

driver lost his life while four others sustained injuries on Thursday night after two vehicles

rammed into each other near Yangoji, on the Abuja-Lokoja Expressway.

A witness said the accident happened at about 5.45pm when a Honda car with registration

number AD 821 LKJ, said to be on high speed, dangerously overtook another vehicle and collided with an unmarked oncoming Volkswagen Golf car.

He said the Honda driver died immediately after the steering wheel trapped him, while men of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) at Yangoji took four passengers in the Golf car including the driver who sustained various degrees of injuries to the hospital.

When contacted, Yangoji Unit Commander of the FRSC, Assistant Corps Commander Jeremiah M. Fada, confirmed the accident.

He attributed it to tyre burst from the Honda car, saying the driver's corpse has been deposited at the Kwali General Hospital's morgue, while the four injured victims are receiving treatment at the emergency ward of the hospital.

He further disclosed that a commercial cyclist was injured in another accident that occurred on Sunday evening at Lambata village, on the Abuja-Lokoja Expressway.

He said the accident occurred around 8.37pm when the cyclist was crossing the road, before an unmarked over speeding vehicle ran over him, saying the corpse was taken to Kwali General Hospital.
