NIGERIANS GROAN AS POWER SURGE CLAIMS

The incidence of fire outbreaks associated with power surges across the country seems to have risen in the last few month claiming lives and property worth millions of naira

Only last week, the Independent National Electoral

Commission (INEC) resident electoral commissioner in

Kano State, Alhaji Munkaila Abdullahi, died along with his wife and two children in a fire linked to power surge

in their Sir Kashim Road, Nasarawa GRA home.

gutted residence after the air conditioner caught fire around 4.30am penultimate Friday.

Less than three days after the Kano inferno, Mr. Ahmed Jimoh, lost his life in similar circumstances in the Kubwa, an Abuja suburb.

Neighbours said there had been frequent power fluctuations in the area and one the fateful day he died caused the air conditioner in his living room to burst into flames that engulfed the building.

Mrs. Jimoh, who was in the living room at the time, was badly burnt and is in intensive care while Mr. Jimoh lost his life trying to rescue his family.

Earlier in March, fire gutted the Friendship with Christ Home for the Poor also in Kubwa.

Dr. Tochukwu Anojulu, foundress of the home, explained that she noticed that when power was restored: "Our light bulbs began blowing up. I realised it was as a result of high voltage. I immediately went to the change-over unit and changed the phase to one with more regular voltage. I then went on to change the destroyed bulbs."

Two days later while preparing for the day, she perceived the smell of wires burning: "In my night dress, I went looking for the source and just as I headed to the children's bedroom, I saw the ceiling and mattresses in flames. I raised alarm and neighbours came to help put out the fire (after literarily everything in the flat was destroyed). About 20 minutes after, fire fighters came and they succeeded in putting it out."

Unable to rescue any of her belongings, she is now battling court and allegations from her landlord that she deliberately set the house on fire.

Following the rainfall in parts of Abuja last Wednesday, some residents of Dawaki Extension lost a good number of their home appliances and gadgets to power surge.

Buba Abubakar said: "When power came back after the rain, I heard something like an explosion and immediately
