in that country for routine consultations by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs", he said.

According to the presidential aide, recall of an envoy is a serious and sensitive matter, "that has not happened."

Five die in Kogi radio station bombing

Five people died yesterday when a community radio station in, Kuroko, Adavi Local Government Area of Kogi State, TAO FM, was bombed by unknown gunmen.

It was gathered that the bombers entered the premises of the radio station at about 7:30 pm pretending to place a commercial and were allowed inside by security guards.

After entering the building, they moved straight to the operation room and threw explosives, killing five people on duty.

The motive for the bombing was unknown at press time yesterday.

A son of the owner of the building used by the station, Yahaya Ogidi Otaru who lives there, told *Daily Trust* that he went out to buy something at a nearby shop and met the situation on his return.

Kogi State police spokesman, Collins Adebayo, said he could not confirm the casualty figure, but confirmed the explosion. He said security had been beefed up in the area while investigation commences. WUITU TICU
