One dies, 2 injured as trailer rams into cars at Aseni

after a trailer rammed into two vehicles on Saturday evening near Aseni village, on the Abuja-Lokoja expressway.

A witness said the accident happened around 4:23 p.m. when the driver of a Daf trailer lost control while on speed and rammed into two vehicles coming from the opposite direction.

He said seven passengers from an unmarked Nissan car and a Sharon Volkswagen car were seriously injured, while one person died on the spot.

"The driver of the trailer lost control

and rammed into two vehicles coming from Lokoja end. The crash led to the death of one passenger," he said.

The witness added that men of the Gegu unit command of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) were alerted immediately and they arrived the scene to evacuate the victims and the dead passenger to hospital.

The Gegu FRSC unit commander, Mr. Ahmed S. Daura, could not be reached for comment, but an official at the command confirmed the incident.

He said seven persons, including one female, were involved in the accident, disclosing that one person died, while two others sustained injuries and were taken to Ideal Clinic at Koton-Karfe in Kogi State.

In a similar incident, three persons were also injured in a motor accident which occurred on Friday afternoon near Gada-Biyu village, on the Abuja-Lokoja expressway.

A witness said the accident happened around 3:11 p.m. when the driver of a Golf car with registration number XD 428 RBC lost control and crashed into a ditch.

He said the injured were rescued by sympathisers before the arrival of men of the FRSC.

The Abaji unit commander of the FRSC, Moses Audu, confirmed the accident, saying the victims were taken to hospital by sympathisers before the arrival of his men.
