FARMER HACKED TO DEATH IN KUJE

Residents of Achimbi community in Kuje Area Council in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), were recently thrown into confusion after a farmer was said to have been hacked to death by unidentified persons.

A relative of the deceased, who gave his name as Shuaibu, said the deceased went to the farm on that fateful day but failed to return home.

He said members of the family traced him to the farm, where they found his corpse with cuts on his head and the body covered with grasses.

"On that day, the deceased was contemplating whether to go to the farm or not to the extent that one of his younger brothers told him to suspend going to the farm till the next day since his mind was telling him not to go," he said.

He said an hour later, the deceased left to the farm but did not return.

Shuaibu said his motorcycle was set ablaze by his assailants, adding that the incident was immediately reported at the Kwaku Police Outpost.

"A policeman and two vigilantes at Kwaku village went to see the corpse before members of his family took it for burial," he added.

Our reporter learnt that prior to the incident, the deceased had a misunderstanding with some herders, who allegedly moved their cows into his farm and destroyed his crops about a month ago.

Efforts to get the reaction of police officers at Kwaku Police Outpost over the incident failed as none of them was willing to speak with our reporter.
