Plateau community seeks justice over killing of 3

Members of Irigwe community of Bassa local government area of Plateau state yesterday tasked the police and the state government to apprehend the gunmen responsible for the killing of three youths from Bonwo village of their community last year.

Daily Trust gathered that the incident occurred in November last year but the community in a press statement yesterday said it knew the culprits and that they were allowed to walk freely without being arrested.

The statement which was signed by the President and Secretary of the community association, Chinge Dodo and John Gana said the victims where waylaid by their assailants but that two others had managed to escape the attack.

"The statement stressed that as a peace loving community, the matter was immediately reported to the Divisional Police Headquarters in
