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Police arraign 6 over 'killing' of sergeant

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The Gombe State Police Command has arraigned six male residents of Kulishin village of Shongom Local Government Area of the state before a Chief Magistrate Court 5 sitting in Gombe, over alleged murder of a policeman.

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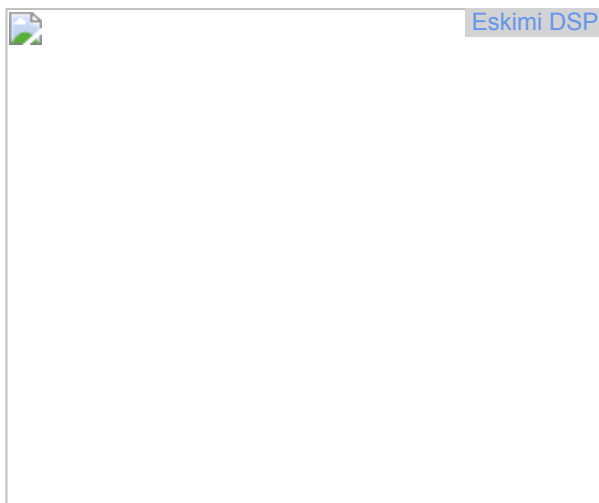
The accused persons, Stephen Obed, 52, Shongom Adamu, 45, Laumai Wana, 32, Timo Magaji, 34, Salim Stephen, 20 and Ngune Adamu, 50, face six-count charge of criminal conspiracy, culpable homicide, possession of fire arms, causing disturbance, mischief by fire and trespass.

Police prosecutor, Inspector Idi Buba, told the court that the accused persons conspired with others now at large, armed with firearms and went to Kufayi and Lakshikoldok villages where they allegedly set fire on the villages.

The court also heard that the accused persons shot to death a policeman, late Sergeant Abdul Mohammed, of Mobile Police Squadron 59, who was part of police team deployed to restore law and order during the crisis.

The presiding Judge, Chief Magistrate Daurabo Sulaiman Sikam, adjourned the case to August 24, and ordered the accused remanded in prison.

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
