Police parade woman over killing of stepson

n housewife Hindatu
Abdullahi of 'Wuro
Boggo village, Duguri District
in Alkaleri Local Government
Area of Bauchi State, who
allegedly killed the two-week
old son of her co-wife Fatima
Abdullahi, was paraded by the
police in yesterday.

She was paraded alongside other suspects including kidnappers and cattle rustlers by the Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Kamal Datti, at the Bauchi State Police

Command.

He said the police personnel attached to Maina Ma'aji Division arrested Hindatu on August 19 after receiving a report on the case from some of the family members.

According to him, the suspect committed the alleged offence after their husband, Abdullahi Ori, had left for Saudi Arabia for this

year's pilgrimage.

Datti further said that the suspect allegedly collected the child from his mother, the cowife, went to her room with the baby and put a dangerous insecticide (pia-pia) into his mouth as a result of which he fainted and was taken to a nearby dispensary for

emergency medical attention where he later died.

"The suspect was arrested and the remaining quantity of the insecticide recovered was in the process of scientific examination. Meanwhile the suspect confessed to the offence of which she will be charged to court after investigation," he said.

the following exhibits: one single barrelled gun, 3 live cartridges, one cooking pot and one military uniform," he added.

The command stated that all the cases were under investigation after which the suspects would be taken to court. It urged members of the public to always provide useful information that might assist the police in making the state safe and to report any suspicious person or object to the nearest station.
