Police confirm 6 killed in Adamawa-Taraba border clashes

The police have confirmed the death of six people in the Monday night clashes between herders and farmers at Adamawa-Taraba border.

Farmers and herders have been locked in circle of attacks and reprisals resulting in death and destruction of property.

Speaking to Daily Trust on phone, the Police spokesman in Adamawa State, SP Abubakar Othman, refuted

media reports that 50 persons died in the Monday night attacks on villages.

He said two Fulani men and four members of farming communities were killed in the clashes while four houses were burnt.

Meanwhile, the Commissioner of Information and Strategy, Ahmad Sajoh, has condemned the incessant clashes in Numan and Demsa areas, saying the state government was working toward achieving a lasting

solution to the problem.

A military official, who did not want his name published, said military authorities at the 23 Armoured Brigade in Yola held series of meetings with senior government officials in Adamawa and Taraba to broker peace between communities.

He also said six persons lost their lives in the attack, adding that police men and DSS operatives were dispatched to assist the soldiers.
