## C/River monarch dies in police custody

The traditional ruler of Buanchor community Boki Local Area Government of Cross River State, Henry Okong, has died in police custody after one month in detention.

arrested He was on August 3 and over interrogated a mob attack on a accused of woman witchcraft at Okundi

village. later He was transferred the to state police command headquarters Calabar for further interrogation and kept in detention until his death on August 26. While in detention, he lost his 33-year-old son.

Circumstances surrounding the monarch's remains unraveled as family sources said they were not allowed

access to him and that he was deprived of medical care.

His lawyer, Olivier Osang, said: "Three weeks ago, when the traditional ruler took ill, he pleaded with the police authorities and they took him to their clinic where he was referred to another hospital. The police authorities refused to grant him bail or take him to the prescribed hospital.

officer "The in

charge of the case SUPOL Okonkwo said he could not have released the late chief in the absence of the police commissioner whom he said was away on Sallah holiday.

"As I speak to you, the body of the late traditional ruler is not yet released to his community. Nothing was found to suggest that he was culpable in the crime for which he

was detained".
