## 2 die, 5 injured in Ogun road crashes

Two persons died while five others sustained serious injuries in two separate accidents along the Lagos-Ibadan expressway.

It was gathered that the first accident involved three vehicles - a Mack tanker with registration number KSD 60 XA, a trailer marked MUS 943

XW, and another trailer marked LSR 431 XP.

The accident, which occurred at the Kwayakiyama axis of the Lagos-Ibadan expressway, involved seven persons, out of which two died and two others were injured.

A report made available to Eko Trust yesterday in Abeokuta by the Federal **Road Safety Corps** (FRSC) Public Education Officer, Ogun Command, Florence Okpe, confirmed the incident, attributing it to "loss of control from excessive speed, tyre burst and brake failure."

Okpe said that the injured victims were taken to an undisclosed hospital, while "the relations from the Muslim community took the dead bodies away for burial".

According to her, another accident which occurred at kilometre 46 on the Lagos-Ibadan expressway involved a Toyota Camry with registration number 47R-59 FG and a Toyota car marked KTU 227 XS. Three of the persons involved in the accident were injured.

Okpe quoted the Sector Commander, Clement Oyedele, as imploring motorists to resist driving against traffic and maintain the stipulated 50km per hour maximum speed limit.
