## Police trailing Kano cop's killer – CP

The police in Kano State are working to get the killer of a police Inspector, Isiyaku Babaji, who was stabbed at his residence in Sharada Quarters early Thursday.

The Commissioner of Police, Mr. Ahmed Iliyasu, confirmed the death of the inspector yesterday.

Though he didn't give details, he said many suspects had been arrested over the murder, even as operatives of the command on Operation Puff-adder are vigorously on the trail of the killer.

He said some of those arrested were undergoing interrogation at the Criminal Intelligence and Investigation Department in connection with the murder.

Daily Trust learnt that an intruder knocked on the door of the policemen and stabbed him to death with a dagger as he opened the door.

CP Iliyasu also yesterday paraded 116 suspects over various crimes including armed robbery, kidnapping, and car snatching among others. They were arrested from various locations across the state.

Among the suspects was the alleged kidnapper and killer of an 8-year-old girl who was abducted from amidst her siblings on their way home from an Islamiya School at Tudun-Wada, Nassarawa LGA of the state.
