

Monarch sues for peace after death of 2 oil workers in Imo

Assa of Ohaji/Egbema Area Council in Imo State is gradually regaining normalcy after days of restiveness following the killing of two youths of the community by a truck driver working for an oil company in the community.

Our correspondent gathered that the truck ran into the youths, identified as Johnmark Rufus and Friday Amadi and instantly killed them.

The death of the two, said to be working for Lee Engineering Facility, had sparked off demonstration by the youths who invaded the oil facility and vandalised its equipment.

The traditional ruler of Assa Community, Eze Emmanuel Assor, said to be instrumental in calming the restive youths, told newsmen that his intervention is yielding fruits as the youths have started returning properties belonging to engineering firm.
