

Pregnant woman, baby, policeman, other die in Oyo auto crash

A pregnant woman, a two-year-old baby, policeman and an old woman lost their lives in an auto accident on Iseyin-Saki Road in the Oke Ogun zone in Oyo State.

An unconfirmed report initially claimed that 11 people died in the accident, but state Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), SP Gbenga Fadeyi, told New Telegraph that

only four people died in the accident.

He said: "Only four people died in the accident."

The accident, which occurred on Tuesday night at Agunrege town, involved an 18-seater Urvan bus going from Ibadan to the area and a stationary DAF truck.

The accident occurred about 9pm when the Saki-bound 18-seater bus ran into the DAF truck, leading to the death of four of the passengers.

The driver of the bus reportedly dosed off while on motion which made the vehicle to veer off its

lane and collide with the stationary truck.

He said: "Only four people died in the accident."

11 killed in Oyo road crash

No fewer than eleven people, including a pregnant woman, 2-year-old baby, an aged woman, a police officer, and seven others lost their lives in a ghastly motor accident that occurred along Iseyin-Saki road, in Oyo state.

The state Police Public Relations Officer, Olugbenga Fadeyi confirmed the accident.

The accident, according

to an eyewitness, occurred at Arunrege town, and involved an 18-seater Urvan bus coming from Ibadan, and a stationed DAF truck.

Daily Trust gathered that the accident occurred at about 9.00 p.m. when the Saki-bound 18-seater bus reportedly ran into the stationed DAF truck.

It was suspected that the driver of the bus had slept off while on the wheel and the vehicle consequently veered off its lane to collide with the

stationary truck.

Eleven out of the thirteen passengers in the ill-fated bus reportedly died instantly after the collision. The Oyo State Sector Commander of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), Mrs Uche Chukwurah, when contacted, said the command was not in the picture of the accident.

She said since the accident occurred in the night, nobody had lodged any report at the command.
