## 3 die, 17 injured as bus crashes on Lagos-Ibadan Expressway

Three people yesterday died while 17 others sustained varying degrees of injuries when a bus crashed along the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway.

The lone crash which involved a bus marked GGE584Y occurred at about

1:30pm around Sandcrete along the highway.

The spokesman of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC), Ogun Command, Florence Okpe, confirmed the accident in Abeokuta.

She blamed the accident on tyre bust, speeding, and loss of control. Okpe said the injured victims had been taken to Victory Hospital, Ogere, while the three corpses had been deposited at FOS Ipara.

While commiserating with the family of the victims, she enjoined them to contact the FRSC Ogunmakin unit for more information about the crash.
