According to him, the vigilantes who were led by one of their members from Sukuku, went into the forest on Wednesday evening in search of the kidnappers' den till Thursday morning when, he said, the vigilante encountered the kidnappers in a shootout.

"And despite the exchange of gunfire with the kidnappers, bullets did not penetrate any of them. They used a piece of wood to hit one of the vigilantes on the head killing him instantly, while one of the kidnappers hiding in a tree shot and killed the second vigilante member," he said.

He said despite the vigilantes running out of bullets, there was also casualty on the side of the kidnappers, saying corpses of some of the kidnappers that were killed were still in the forest.

"The kidnappers who tried to evacuate the corpses of their members to another hideout were killed at a forest in Lanto village of Kuje Area Council," he also said.

A resident of Sukuku village, simply identified as Abednego, said some of the vigilantes rode motorcycles while others came inside pickup vans to the village before moving towards the bandits' den.

The spokeswoman of the FCT Police Command, DSP Adeh Josephine, did not reply to a text message sent to her phone over the incident as at the time of filing this report.
