

PDP woman leader dies after eating kolanut

A popular woman leader of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) in Ekiti State, Mrs. Bosede Olori Adaja, has died mysteriously after allegedly chewing kolanut given to her at a political meeting.

The 52 year-old woman, hailed from Ise-

Ekiti, Ekiti State and married to a police officer, Mr. Adaja, from Delta State, however living alone after the break up of the marriage.

A family member, Tope Falade, who spoke to Daily Times Nigeria, alleged that the "mysterious kolanut" was given to her at a PDP meeting held at the Ajilosun party secretariat in Ado-Ekiti, last

Tuesday.

Tope further revealed that a friend of the deceased visited her the following day and the host served beer for the entertainment before the unfortunate incident happened.

Narrating the situation, Falade alleged that the deceased brought out the kolanut given to her and ate part of it before extending same to her

friend but the friend did not eat out of it.

Bosede, popularly called Olori in political circles, was said to have developed strange symptoms immediately, and spirited efforts to calm the situation did not yield any results, as her condition grew worse.

She later went to take her bath in order to find immediate solution to her

condition but when she emerged later she started foaming from the mouth.

She was said to have been rushed to the hospital, through the assistance of her friends but on their way to the hospital she allegedly gave up the ghost. The source said her body had been deposited at the Ado-Ekiti State Specialist Hospital mortuary.
