



2 KILLED IN AUTO CRASH ALONG GIRI-AIRPORT ROAD

Two persons lost their lives while two others sustained various degrees of injuries in a ghastly motor accident last Friday near Dantata construction yard, along Giri-Airport road.

A witness said the accident happened around 9:15 am when a Volkswagen Golf car with registration number LSR 322 PJ overtook a vehicle and had a collision with an oncoming Toyota Carina car with registration number LSD 586 AY, killing the two persons on the spot.

He said the dead persons were trapped immediately the two vehicles collided while officials of the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) were alerted to evacuate both the injured and corpses of the dead ones to the hospital.

When contacted, Gwagwalada unit commander of the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), Alhaji Ahmed Abubakar, confirmed that two persons died while two others were injured in the accident which he attributed to dangerous overtaking.

He said the two corpses have been deposited at the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital morgue at Gwagwalada, adding that the two injured victims are also receiving treatment at the same hospital.

Our reporter learnt that four persons were also injured when two vehicles collided last Thursday at the University of Abuja permanent site junction, along Airport road.

A witness told our reporter at the scene that the accident happened around 6:12 pm when a Toyota Corolla car with registration number XA 559 XA loaded with yams collided with another Toyota car with registration number XB 594 RBC, leaving the four persons wounded.

"The Toyota Corolla car was going against traffic, and was on top speed when he suddenly collided with a car coming from the opposite direction. The victims were taken to the hospital by sympathizers before the arrival of the FRSC," a witness said.

When contacted, Gwagwalada unit commander of the FRSC, Alhaji Ahmed Abubakar, said the command was not aware of the accident.
