According to him, the vigilance group got information that some of the cult members had run to hide in Ikenne, a

nearby town.

The vigilance members then storm the town at dawn to fish them out.

The fate of the person allegedly kidnapped remained uncertain yesterday evening as the captors were yet to release him.
