MASSOB calls for trial of detained members

DISTURBED by the continued detention without trial of their members numbering no few than 55 in various police cells, leadership of the Movement for the Actualisation of the Sovereign State of Biafra (MASSOB), has called on the police to charge them to court without further delay.

In a statement by the movement's Deputy Director of Information, Mazi Chris Mocha and made available yesterday to The Guardian in MASSOB Owerri, claimed that out of initial 116 persons arrested and detained as members of the group on June 17 in Awka, Anambra State, seven had died_ in cell, some membership denied while 54 and several others had been set free on alleged extortion of N70, 000 each from relations.

In the statement enti-"MASSOB tled: demands trial of 55 suspected members" the group said: "MASSOB is not happy with the police for arbitrarily arresting Igbo Biafrans and hounding them into custody for months on allegations mere members of being **MASSOB** without charging them to court. They should be charged to court without further delay."

Council chief accuses ALGON of

ANOTHER can of worms has been opened on the alleged N46 million scam rocking 18 local council areas of Ondo State, as the chairman of Ilaje Council, Dr. Adebanbo Odoro, yesterday testified that his signature was forged by the Association of Local Government of Nigeria (ALGON) to perpetrate the fraud.

Odoro, who was giving evidence before the State House of Assembly committee, led by Mr. Kingsley Kuku that is looking into the finances of the 18 local council areas of the state, said the money would have been deducted from his account without his knowledge.

"My chairman, I received 200 doses of anti-typhoid vaccine and I did not know whether it was free or the amount of money deducted from my council's account," he said.

When the panel chairman told him not to be surprised if he

was confronted with the signature he signed for the procurement of the vaccine in question, Odoro quickly replied that they forged his signature to perpetrate the fraud.

"I want to say that whenever we held our meetings, we use to put our names and signatures in the paper to attest to the fact that we did attend the meeting and that from one of such meetings, my signature might have been reproduced for the alleged N46 million scam," he protested.

"I heard about the scam when the panel started and I did not know that the 200 doses given to us were free of charge from the National ALGON.

According to him: "I know that a certain amount was being deducted from my council's account, which I could not know for now until I go through my record for 2004."
