Some members of the Dee-bam were allegedly killed about two weeks ago by the Deewell group.

The allegation is rife that the two groups are being sponsored by some promi-nent Ogoni politicians who are bent on controlling the politics of the area. The bat-tle for supremacy between the Deewell and Deebam gangs has claimed over 18

gangs has claimed over 18 lives in the past four months A cleric, who pleaded anonymity, disclosed to *The Guardian* in a telephone interview that the scores of

Deewell members drawn various communities le Ogoni land had from outside outside Ogoni land nad stormed the town yesterday morning and went after sus-pected members of their Deebam. ch rival,

He explained that the fierce battle, which involved shooting, claimed four lives involved while several others suffered severe injuries. According to him, the resumption of hos-tility forced a lot of people to close their shops to avoid being struck by stray bullet. "The situation in Bodo is

really depressing. Just when we thought this notorious and obnoxious gang war had ended, these dare devils these started again yesterday. Peo-ple are now scared of going about their daily business

because

about their daily business because you don't know when they will strike again. We have had enough bloodbath and this must stop, said. He said the youths were bragging openly as they marched through the streets of Bodo that they had acquired more lethal weapons to be used in the

acquired extermination of their opponents. The cleric expressed concern that the conflict might take a more precari-ous dimension if the govern-ment failed to act swiftly.
