# Assassins invade PDP Reception Party, Kill Police Officer

GALE of politically-imotivated killings in Ekiti State appear not to be over as suspected assas-sins went on the prowd, last Friday night, in search of some members of Peoon some members of Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) in the state.

A member of the House of Representation

of Representatives, Samuel Adeyemi, escaped the hoodlums' gunshot as he ran into a nearby bush when the armed men invaded a hotel in Ado-Ekiti where a reception was planned for members of the PDP electoral com-

mittee in the state.
But the state PDP chairman, Ropo Adesanya was unlucky as the assassins descended on him and inflicted injuries on his head with the butt of their guns. The mobile police man attached to him was however, killed by the

attackers.
The PDP boss, who is on admission at the state gov-ernment house clinic, was

EXPECTATIONS by Nigerians that come 2015, potable water would be available in every home may not be realisable going by the Human Development Report 2006 which was Report 2006, which was unveiled last Thursday in

Abuja.
This year's report, titled This year's report, titled "Beyond Scarcity: Power, Poverty and the Global Water Crisis" was, as usual, devoted to an investigation of the broad vision, set out in the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), which is the internationally agreed set time-bound goals for reducing bound goals for reducing extreme poverty, extend-ing gender equality and advancing opportunities for health and education.

The report, which focused on water and sanitation, located 2046 as the possible earliest date for all Nigerians to have access to safe water at affordable cost and a safe environment.

In spite of this grim report, President Oluse-gun Obasanjo who gun Obasanjo wno launched the report said there is remarkable progress in the provision of water by his adminis-

"Funding for the sector has steadily increased from less than N8 billion in 1998 to about N55 billion in 2006, in addition to 100 billion naira set aside from the debt relief gains in the 2006 budget in the MDGs key sectors, which include water resources development," he said. "This is clear evi-dence of our priority attention to the sector." The UNDP Resident

Representative, Alberic Kacou said despite the global consensus that water is absolutely important, close to 20 per cent of the would population does not have access to clean water.
