site of the explosion, could not proceed towards the point where the fire was raging. The trucks, with registration number XG 629 AKD (Lagos) from the NNPC, were stuck in the mud and could not move

swampy terrain, most of the pipes that were attached to the fire trucks were leaking. thus making it impossible for the water to be transported to

the point of the raging fire. The Public Affairs Manager of PPMC, Ralph Ugwu, told The Guardian that the corporation's engineers had succeeded in sealing the exposed spot, although reports said fire at the spot was still burning by press time. Ugwu said his men would work with the police and NSCDS to prevent

genes of his community had no hands in the matter, stating that the plank bridge, which provided shabby access to the spot, was constructed by the NNPC when the community lodged complaints of vandalisation.
