SENTENCED: AN Abuja High Court has sentenced a senior police officer in the rank of Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP) to four years for receiving N5, 000 bribe from an accused person last year.

o e e EDO ROBBERY: DARE-DEVIL robbers have continued to have a fields day along the Lagos-Benin expressway. During the week, they went on rampage with heavy shooting and succeeded in robbing over seven inter-state buses with little resistance from the police. Passengers of one of the buses said they saw some mobile policemen running into the bush, only to come out shortly after the robbery operation.

ARRESTED: ON January 13, at about 11pm, an anti-robbery team attached to Akinpelu Police station, acting on a tip-off, arrested one Chibuzor Ilouba with one locally-made double barrel gun, one locally made pistol and three live cartridges. Adesina also lost a sum of N25, 000 to the thieves when he was attacked while repairing his vehicle at Pako Bus stop, Agboju along Badagry Expressway.
