renewed hostility might not be unconnected with the sharing of money given to the community by oil companies operating in Kula. There were indications,

however, that the group behind the killing of four prominent Kula leaders: Dan Opunsunji, A.D Opuary, Eferebo Lilly, Obaye Ojika and 15 others in January car-

ried out the latest raid. A source in Kula, who pleaded anonymity, told The Guardian that the militants first attacked the community last Sunday and killed three persons. Apparently not satisfied with the casualty inflicted on the people, they returned on Monday,

killing two additional per-

sons.
