ARRESTED: - On March 2, about 10:10am, a team of detectives from the State CID Panti, arrested one Rasaki Aremu of Alaba, Ojo with 11 expended shells of .9mm ammunition, Police Beret Cap, one Identity Card, Army Uniform and assorted charms. The suspect is under going interrogation to ascertain the sources of the discovered items.

FATAL ACCIDENT: - On March 3, at about 5:45pm, a report was received at Orile Police Station that a commercial coaster bus, with Reg. No. XN.286 EKY driven by one Chinanasor Okeke of No. 15, Owolabi Street, Aguda ran over a yet-to-be identified adult male pedestrian, at Dovin B/Stop, along Badagry-Lagos Expressway. The victim died on the spot.

Similarly on March 2, at about 4pm, the Ilupeju Police Station received a report that a vehicle, Reg. No. CH. 61 LSD, driven by one Tajudeen Odesanmi of Block 507, flat 1, Oke Afa Street, Isolo, ran over one Victoria Ochei of No. 4, Awoyokun Street, Onipanu, along Awoyokun Street. The victim was rushed to the hospital where she later died.

MURDER: On March, 5, at about 7pm, a report was lodged at State CID Panti-Yaba, that members of the Onikoyi Unit, Orile Agege, Gani Adams' faction of the OPC, while driving dangerously in a convoy of commercial buses, including a Toyota Hiace Bus, Reg. No. XC 781 AGL, according to eyewitness account, ran over a vet-to-be-identified motorcyclist and a passenger at Ahamadiya Bus Stop, along Abeokuta Expressway. Rather than assist victims to get medical attention, the OPC men alighted from their buses and matcheted the two to death. The case is under investigation.

FIRE INCIDENT: On March 1, at about 10:45am, information was received at Ikorodu Police Station that there was fire outbreak at Block C, Flat 3, Ikorodu Police Barracks. Cause of fire is suspected to have emanated from an electric cooker. A Police search and rescue team, led by the DPO, rescued children trapped inside the flat. The value of property d
