The Guardian was informed that the renewed violence was a spill-over of an earlier one in the Epe area of the state last Sunday, in which many supporters

reportedly injured after receiving machete wounds.

The violence yesterday forced the State Police Command to deploy a team of anti-riot mobile policemen in the area.
