Six feared killed over oil workers'

Port Harcourt T least six persons were feared dead yesterday at Minikpiti-Rumuolumeni community, near Port Har-court following a reprisal attack by unknown gunn-men over the murder of the President of Rumuolumeni

Youth Council, Mr. Golden

Isi. The attack forced hundreds of persons, particularly

strangers residing at both Rumuolumeni and Iwofe area of the Rivers State cap-

ital, to flee to avoid being caught in the crossfire.
Sources at Rumuolumeni told The Guardian that a group of heavily-armed perhad forced their way into Isi's house and shot him several times. And as they were

escaping, they shot sporadically in the air to scare people.

The Guardian gathered that when the news of Isi's murder got to his paternal home in one of the riverine

communities of the state, irate youths from there allegedly wrote a letter to the Rumuolumeni community, directing that they produce Isi's killers or face reprisal attack.

By noon, report said, scores of armed youths whose identity remained

unknown began what turned out to be a reprisal attack on Guardian gather Thegathered that at least six persons were killed though the Police put figure at two.

The death of Isi, a former National Vice Chairman of

NUPENG and also a staff of Aker Oil Services limited, an oil servicing company in Rumuolumeni, might not be unconnected with his agitation for greater employment opportunities for youths in

the area. Hundreds of Rumuolumeni residents fleeing from the attacks said that the youths involved had killed over five persons and injured several others.
