State counterpart over the disputed area. A clash in the area had last week claimed three lives, after the two communities disagreed over a stretch of land considered fertile, which Bebe sold to Gob Logo Company Limited, producers of Cassava chips.

The fresh clash started on Friday evening when some militiamen suspected to be from Sankyula, a border village in Mbaliko of Bebe invaded Ikpagajir, another border town in Mbakpeghe, injuring several persons and destroying houses in the process. Though no lives were lost in the invasion, which took place late in the night, the policemen stationed in the buffer zone were helpless as they could not track down the nocturnal invaders.
