## MASSOB denies report on alleged killing of members

NO fewer than 12 bodies suspected to be those of some members of the Movement for the Actualisation of the Sovereign State of Biafra (MASSOB) were on

Wednesday seen floating on the River Niger at Elenchele Island. The bodies were discov-

ered after a bloody clash between the members of MASSOB and a joint military/police task force last Tuesday morning at Onitsha.

The victims were said to have jumped into the river as the battle ragged, resulting to several casualties and deaths around the alleged MASSOB hideout.

Some of the deaths had resulted from bullet wounds while the rest had died by drowning in an attempt to escape from the encounter.

According to an eyewitness account, members of the movement had relocated to the Island from Akpaka Forest where they had allegedly been involved in violent crimes that included incessant kidnapping, abductions
