but a struggle by some miscreants to get money from Alao-Akala.

The governor, who had gone

Bodija market, escaped unhurt from the scene. However, reporters in his entourage were not so lucky

as their bus, which was at the tail end of the convoy, was riddled with stones.

Unconfirmed reports also said that policemen in the

convoy, in their bid to ward off the hoodlums, shot into their midst but it could not be ascertained if anyone was killed or injured.

Oyelade, however debunked claims that the governor's convoy was attacked, saying his boss had left the venue before the inci-

dent and only left behind the press crew.

One of the injured reporters, Mr. Gbenga Abegunde, of the Daily Independent said he was bit on the chest when
