## Robbers Kill One In Lagos, Three Die In Rivers

NE person was killed and three others injured yesterday as robbers raided Alaba Rago Market in Iba Local Council Development Area,

Lagos.
At least two other per-

Ijebus Celebrate sons are feared dead at Ogbo village in Ahoada East Local council Area of Rivers State while digging a trench belonging to the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC).

In Lagos, the armed robbers who came with motorcycles and vehicles capitalised on the Sallah that prevented the traders from going to bank and made away

with millions of naira.

They stormed the rice section with dangerous

weapons and raided

about 40 shops.

The robbers whose target was money did not tamper with rice.

The name of the deceased was given as Balarabe Abubakar, while those wounded included Musa Abdulahi, Garba Tuko and Ismaila Ibrahim.

According to the Sarki (Alabo Rago Market), Alhaji Umar Sokoto, it was a shock as the armed robbers only took advantage of the Sallah that made the traders not to deposit their money in banks.

"We have two banks in

the market and were it

not for the Sallah, this would have been averted. "Though they did not steal rice, they made

away with about 20 rams," he said.

The Sarkin of the market said as soon as he learnt of the robbery, he

contacted the two police

stations in the area but before they came around, probably due to bad roads, the armed robbers had finished their operations and fled.

Also confirming the theft, the chairman of the rice section of the market, Isaac Nwoke, and vice chairman, Alhaji Shaibu Gezawa said they were caught unawares. "A similar incident happened about 10 years ago and

so no one expected such a recurrence," he explained. "No doubt, insiders must have been among the armed robbers because no one would have known the shops where money was kept.

In Rivers State, The Guardian learnt that the victims were buried alive by heaps of sand from the trench they were digging around the NNPC pipeline in Ogbo.

Three persons who are currently receiving

treatment in an undisclosed hospital in the area were injured dur-

ing the incident.

The Rivers State Police
Public Relations Officer
(PPRO), Mrs Ireju
Baresua who confirmed
the incident to The
Guardian said the
police were carrying out
investigations to find
out if the victims were
members of NNPC or
pipeline vandals.
