How NPA Loses Billions Through Shady Practices

HOUGH Nigerians are beginning to question the fise fulness of the ongoing probe of some federal projects and its parastatals, a promised probe of the Nigerian Ports Authority (NPA) is likely to turn up even more worms than the much-celebrated power projects probe, as indicated by documents available to The Guardian.

At the launch of the Vision 2020 programme of the Federal Government last week, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Dimeji Bankole, expressed the desire of the House to probe the activities of the NPA. Saying that the organisa-

tion collected about N100

without remitting any of it to the treasury, Bankole said, "how can they spend all that money without for lowing Due Process?"

As it happened, an audit exercise conducted into the finances of the NPA in 2004 revealed a number of institutional weaknesses and corner-cuttings, which had led to loss of millions of Naira through unauthorised channels.

The firm of J.K Randle and Co conducted the exercise — an examination of outstanding bills from the agency's creditors and its purpose was to, among others:

toral officers Meanwhile, former Vice President Atiku Abubakar cast his vote at 11.15am at Ajiya polling booth in Yola North. The Action Congress (AC) governor-ship candidate in Adamawa State, Ibrabim accompanied Bapetel,

After exercising his fran-chise, Atiku told journal-ists that he was satisfied with the preparations of the INEC and the way the electoral materials distributed. But he said he could not

speak on whether the election was properly handled until it was concluded. According to him: "I have

visited only one polling booth and that is where I cast my vote. So, I cannot talk of what happened in other polling centres until after we got reports of what happened in

those places. "Up till Friday, I was satisfied with the way they distributed the materials."

He said INEC has capable hands to conduct free and fair elections in the country, but that the commission needed sincerity of purpose and integrity to do that.

Bapetel, who voted at his Yelwa ward in Jimeta at about 11.18am, expressed satisfaction with the conduct of the election and the security arrangement.

He was also in high spirit and indicated confidence in the

entire process.

And for the PDP candidate, Murtala Nyako, who cast his vote at the Hammanyero olling unit in Mayo-Belwa local government area of the state at about 10.35am, the turn-out of voters, the conduct of the polls and the security arrangement were ade-

quate. Nyako, whose election was nullified based on the petition filed by Bapetel, was optimistic that he would win the election because "power belongs to God and the peo-

The election was generally peaceful in most of the local governments, including Girei, Gombi, Song, Ganye, Fufore, Demsa, Mubi, Shelleng, Yola, Jimeta and Belwa. There was a large turn out of voters in the straight battle between the Peoples Democratic (PDP) and AC.

Officials of the Independent Electoral National Commission started distribu tion of voting materials early. However, the distribution was delayed in some areas while

Security was heavy in all the voting centres where the state police command drafted adequate had policemen to take charge.

Voters started trooping out as early as 8am in Yola, Gombi, Lamurde and Girei local government areas where leaders of political parties were on ground to monitor the exercise

Most of the politicians commended INEC and the police for adequate preparations. But Alhaji Youssof Ahmad, PDP leader in Lamurde, frowned at the activities of some politicity and activities of some politicity. cians, who were accused of thuggery.
