CRIME NOTE

CALL TO ORDER: The Defence headquarters is currently worried over the activities of Naval ratings, which have been mis-behaving against members of the public. The Guardian, learnt at the weekend that the Naval headquarters will soon organise a seminal to lecture young Naval personnel on how to treat members of the public. Recently six Naval Ratings attached to a Rear Admiral assaulted a lady, Miss Uzoma Okere, in Lagos. Another group of ratings shot dead a serving police officer attached to the Ogun State Police Command.

DELTA

Killed: Police men under the state command are now under probe over the killing of an undergraduate student of Madonna University, Akwa, Anambra State. The State Police Commissioner had ordered intense investigation into the alleged involvement of some of his men into the gruesome murder of the young man.

OSUN

ARRAIGNED: A man and his son has been charged to court for allegedly killing a house wife, Mrs. M. Fatunbi. The incident occurred five year ago. They were arraigned recently before an Osogbo magistrate's court. The woman was said had died while she in her pregnancy.

NIGER

ACCIDENT: Tears freely gushed out recently in Munya Local Council of the State, following the death of its six serving councillors. The incident occurred three kilometres to Sarkin Pawa the council headquarters.

BAUCHI

MARCOTICS: Operatives of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency(NDLEA) had seized N5, 000 kilograms of drug substances within six months. Also the command said they arrested 362 suspects within the same period in Bauchi metropolis. The chairman of the agency Alhaji Ahmadu Giade made the disclosure recently. He stressed that NDLEA will continue to fight the menace with a mission to reducing it.

LAGOS

FATAL MOTOR ACCIDENT: On November 10, 2008, at about 1500hrs, report reached the Ilupeju Police Stations of a Fiat Trailer Truck with Reg. No. XK 186 KJA driven by one Segun Jimoh running over a motorcyclist. One Adeleke Johnson close to Oninanu Rus Ston along

Insurance Compulife Ikorodu Road. The victims died on the spot and the corpse has since been taken to the public mortuary for autopsy.

FIRE INCIDENT: On November 11, 2008, at about 0330hrs, the Ajegunle Police Station received a report of fire outbreak at 52, Orodu Street, Ajegunle. The inferno, which was caused by power surge, was put out by members of the public with the assistance of policemen. The value of property destroyed is yet to be ascertained. There was no loss of life.

AREEST OF ARMED ROBBERS/RECOVERY OF ARM: On November 4, 2008, at about 1300hrs, a team of Anti-Robbery Policemen from Igando Police Station while on patrol near Love Hotel, Obadore, intercepted five men, who earlier robbed lodgers at the said hotel of their valuables. They include Tunji Bamigboye of 5, Sanni Alape Close, Iba Town; Olalekan Waliu of 7, Iyegbe, Ojo; Bakare Oluwasegun of 5/6, Onikosi Compound, Iba Ojo; Tope Bolaji of Iba New Site, Ojo and Tegar Ogbodu of 10, Nassan Street, Adeloko, Ajangbadi, Ojo. Items recovered from them are GSM Handsets and one locally made pistol. The case is under investigation.

ARREST OF ARMED ROBBER/RECOVERY OF ARM AND AMMUNITION: On November 9, 2008, about 073hrs, a team of Anti-Robbery Policemen from Elere Police Station while on patrol at Iyana-Odo close to Iyana Ipaja exchanged gunfire with some armed robbers operating in a Volkswagen bus with Reg. No. 463 JJJ. In the process one of the robbers name Sampson Babatunde was arrested while others escaped on foot. One single barrel gun, one live cartridge, four Laptop computer, three handsets, assorted bags operational vehicle were recovered from them. The arrested suspects have made confessional statement that is helping the police. The case has been transferred State CIP Panti-Yaba for further investigation.

DROWNING: On November 9, 2008, at about 2000hrs, the Trade Fair Police Station a report of a 20 - y ear, man, Jonathan Nasidi, old staff of Lakeview Resort allegedly drowned in hotel swimming pool. The scene was immediately visited by police men from the station and the corpse removed to public mortuary for autopsy. The case is under investigation.

FATAL MOTOR ACCIDENT: On November 9, 2008 at about 113hrs, there was a report at Elere Police Station of a trailer truck with reg. No. XB 553 NNF driven by one Richard Okorie running over two pedestrians Rukayat Salami 23 years old and one other at Iyana-Ipana along Abeokuta Expressway. The victims died on the spot. The scene was immediately visited by traffic policemen from the station while the corpses were removed to public mortuary for autopsy. The case is under investigation.
