Abductors kill council chairman's daughter, dump body in school

- Mother, children regain freedom in Bayelsa

THE remains of a 23-year-old young woman kidnapped two weeks ago were on Tuesday found dumped in front of her school, College of Agriculture, Obio Akpa, Akwa Ibom State.

The victim was the daughter of the Chairman of Abak Local Council, Akwa Ibom State, Mr. Aniedi Udo.

Meanwhile, wife of a former Ijaw youth activist, Mrs. Grace Olobio and her three children abducted last week while returning from church in Yenagoa, Bayelsa State capital, have been freed.

The development came about 24 hours after the erstwhile Deputy Chairman of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) in the state, Fyneman Wilson, also breathed the air of freedom after reportedly paying N3 million as ransom to his abductors.

It was unclear if a ransom was paid to secure the release of Mrs. Olobio and her children. A source close to the family confirmed their release.

According to sources in Abak Council who pleaded anonymity, Udo had already paid N10 million to the kidnappers before the body of his daughter was found. They said the victim might have been killed because she had recognised some of her abductors.

The sources said the gruesome murder might not be unconnected with the political tension in Abak arising from Udo's feud with some council members.

The state Commissioner of Police, Walter Joseph Rugbere, confirmed the development and expressed shock over the dastardly act. He assured that the police would do everything possible to bring the perpetrators of the homicide to book.

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
