Two die in military plane crash, NCAA downgrades Kaduna airport

ATWO passenger aircraft belonging to the Nigeria Air Force (NAF) has crashed in Kaduna, killing two officers – a Group Captain and a Flying Officer.

The crash occurred at 3p.m. between Jaji and Kachia. The aircraft is known as Air Beetle used for training by

As at press time, the reason

for the crash was unknown.

Authority (NCAA) yesterday
announced the restriction of
flights by certain aircraft to

the Kaduna Airport.
In a statement yesterday,
Director-General, NCAA,
Harold Demuren, said only
light aircraft would henceforth be cleared to fly to the
airport.

However, Air Traffic Controllers yesterday confirmed the crash of the NAF training aircraft to *The Guardian*, but noted that since the accident involved military aircraft, it would be wrong to comment on it.

On the Kaduna airport,

Demuren disclosed that only aircraft with equivalent maximum fuselage of three metres and over-run length of less than 18 metres like the *Hawker Sidney 125* would be permitted to fly in and out of the airport.

He said the NCAA took the action because the Kaduna Airport lacked adequate fire

Category Seven to category three.

Demuren stated that in line with the NCAA safety over-

cover, which had forced the

authority to downgrade the

status of fire service from

sight functions, the Nigerian Airspace Management Agency (NAMA) had accordingly been directed to issue the Notice to Airmen (NOTAM) dated May 27, 2009 to notify all airlines and other stakeholders of the downgrading.
