Three die in Ogun building collapse

A 30-YEAR old building collapsed at the weekend in Abeokuta, Ogun State killing three persons and seriously injuring nine others. Those who died were fast asleep when the building built on a rock collapsed. The incident occurred at 11:35p.m.

The incident occurred at Oke-Parde area of Ijeun Titun. The dead are two siblings, Mr. Kayode Sormekun and Iyabo Soremekun as well as a young cobbler simply identified as Saheed.

The injured were rushed to the Federal Medical Centre, Abeokuta where they were admitted for treatment. Firemen were reportedly informed as soon as the tragedy occurred but there was little they could do since the three had died before their arrival.

The Ogun State Commissioner for Environment, Adeleke Adedoyin visited the scene of the building collapse and expressed government's regret over the incident.

Adedoyin blamed the area's "topography" for the collapse. He said: "The topography of the building is the major factor for the collapse. It is one disaster too many. The building was not well structured; I learnt it was 30 years."

The commissioner appealed to residents to be cautious when choosing sites to build their home and promised government's assistance for the family of the victims.

He also advised them to insure their persons and property against such mishaps.
