Ebhaleme, said that the blast went off in the morning when residents were still in their

houses.

Ebhaleme said: "The target of the bombers was our men at the checkpoints of Kaleri Ward, but fortunately, only plumes of dust were thrown into the air. No casualty was recorded in bomb

Also, Borno State Police Commissioner, Simeon Midenda, told *The Guardian* that the explosion did not injure any policeman.

He said: "The reports I received from the police commander of the area indicated that there were no casualties from Sunday's bomb blast that sent a lot of dust into the air for over three minutes. No life or property was destroyed or damaged in the blast.
