

Gunmen Kill Policeman, Resident In Maiduguri

DARELY 48 hours after members of the Borno Elders' orum (BOEF) appealed to the Boko Haram sect to lay down its arms and embrace dialogue with the Federal to Government, a policeman and a resident of Gwange ward of Maiduguri metropolis in Borno State were shot dead yesterday at about 1.35pm. Confirming the separate incidents in Maiduguri, the Borno State police spokesman, Gideon Jibrin, said gunmen trailed the policeman and killed him before he reached his resident in Gwange ward.
The resident killed at the Bridge, he added, was also trailed by two gunmen in long kaftans and shot in the head.
