▲ RMED thugs suspected to Thave been hired by land speculators on Tuesday night sacked the residents of Ajambata village near Atan in Ado-Odo Council of Ogun State.

At the end of the three-hour mayhem, two elderly persons were feared killed, many others injured and property worth millions of naira were destroyed Weapons used included guns, cutlasses and other dangerous

objects. One of the dead persons was identified as Bayo Odunaro while the identity of the other deceased could not immediate-

ly be ascertained. An evewitness, who spoke to The Guardian on condition of anonymity, said the invaders announced their presence at about 830 p.m. with sporadic shootings, resulting in the villagers scampering for safety. Also torched was the African
