

Death Of Yakowa, Azazi Shocking, Says Obi

OVERNOR Peter Obi of Anambra State has described as shocking, the death of Governor Yakowa and Gen. Azazi in a helicopter crash yesterday.

NEMA Recovers Six Bodies

THE National Emer-I gency Management Agency (NEMA) said it has recovered six bodies from the scene of the Naval helicopter that crashed yesterday afternoon in Nembe area of Bayelsa

State.

The search and rescue operation, which involved collaboration of response agencies and volunteers, led to the recovery of the bodies of the six passengers on board.

The spokesperson for the agency, Mr. Yushau Shuaib, said the bodies had been deposited in a mortuary and further details on the victims would be announced after their families have been formally informed.
