Ugborodo for several years has been enmeshed in a bloody leadership tussle between two factions which has consequently claimed several lives.

However, the Naval Commander in charge of the Escravos area, Captain Okeniyi, told The Guardian on phone Sunday that nobody was killed.

He said there was an order for troops to be deployed to Aruton village to maintain order in view of the local council election but that when the troops arrived the community the people refused the troop's entry into community.

Okeniyi said the soldiers later moved into the community without harming anyone.


